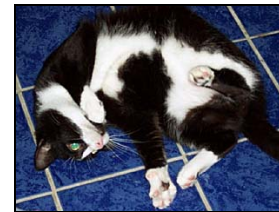
### **Boxer: Two Strikes, but Never Out!**
